I have both a clinical and leadership role. I lead a team of 7 orthoptists and 3 orthoptic assistants. My clinical role involves assessing, diagnosing and treating a variety of patients, working cooperatively with consultant ophthalmologists. I also work closely with other members of the wider ophthalmology team including ophthalmologists, optometrists and ophthalmic nurses. As part of the orthoptic team, I





deliver a variety orthoptic services to children, young people and adults across a wide geographical area within Aneurin Bevan University Health Board.

From a clinical perspective, every day is different. The variety of cases and the ability to make a difference - whether this be treating a child with poor vision or an adult with double vision, are both equally rewarding.
